the fridge.

BUT

I can't say
There is a milk in
the fridge.
There is a bread
in the fridge



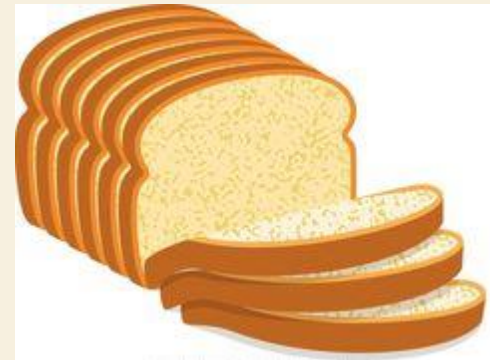


These are called uncountable nouns because we can't count them. So we use **some**.

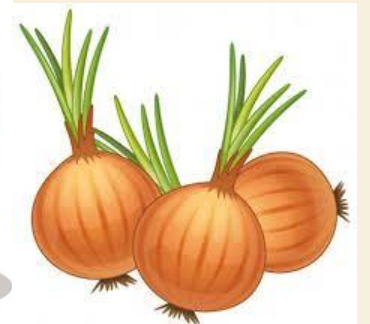




"There is some."

"There are some."
There **are some** apples in the fridge.
There **are some** onions in the fridge.

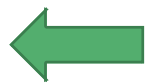
